

DARLOT - Later known as - WOODARRA.

DAVYHURST - Earlier known as - DAVYSTON - and - MACE'S FIND.

LOCATION = Latitude 30° 03' south by Longitude 120° 39' east. South west of the current town of Menzies.

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HISTORY = The *Waihi* mine was discovered by "Watty" DAVYS in November 1899. Other nearby mines were the *Golden Pole*, the *Great Ophir* and the *Callion*.¹ When it was proposed to declare a townsite there in 1900 the site was referred to as Davyston, better known as Mace's Find. Warden OWEN of Menzies then advised the Department the place was known as "Davyhurst", and this was the name used when the townsite was gazetted in 1901. It was named after "Watty" DAVYS.²

By September 1915 the adult population was down to thirty males and eighteen females.³

POLICE & COURTS = The Police station was operating by March 1902.⁴ A Police building appears to have been erected on Siberia Street⁵ in 1906.⁶ The station was closed in October 1915.⁷

POLICE OFFICERS

O'FLAHERTY, [Constable] = He was the 1st Officer in Charge by March 1902.⁸

EAST, [Constable] = He was transferred from there to Kookynie when the station was closed in October 1915.⁹

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION

? **HOTEL** = There was a hotel there by February 1901.¹⁰

DAVYSTON - Earlier name for - DAVYHURST.

DAY DAWN - Originally named - BUNDAWADRA.

LOCATION = Latitude 27° 28 south by Longitude 117° 52 east. In the Murchison Goldfields, about six and a half kilometres from the present town of Cue.

INDUSTRY - Gold mining.

HISTORY = Gold was discovered there by Ted HEFFERMAN in 1892, and he named his discovery "*Day Dawn*", after the time of day that he pegged his claim. Day Dawn was originally gazetted as Bundawadra in 1894, but was changed to Day Dawn within three months. The area developed rapidly from 1898 when the famous *Great Fingall* mine was established.

Flooding and other problems closed the *Great Fingall* mine around the time of the Second World War, and the town of DAY DAWN soon faded away.

UTILITIES = Hugh OLDHAM is listed as the engineer at the Water Supply in the 1898 postal directory.¹¹

POLICE & COURTS = The Police Station opened in November 1894.¹² The police quarters in Heffernan Street were completed in August 1896,¹³ and the lockup in November 1896.¹⁴ The station remained manned until it was closed in August 1919. The buildings were officially and unofficially used as a private residence until sold at tender in 1931.¹⁵

The courthouse building was erected in 1904 and shifted to Yalgoo in 1921.¹⁶

POLICE OFFICERS

ALLISS, John [Probationary Constable/ No.293] = He was transferred from Perth in March 1897 and then transferred to Mount Magnet in March 1898.¹⁷

BAKE, Harman Collingwood [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.692] = He was transferred from Mount Magnet in November 1902 and then transferred to Perth in June 1906.¹⁸

BARRY, Martin Patrick [Probationary Constable/ No.135] = He was transferred from Perth in November 1894 and then transferred to Geraldton in January 1897.¹⁹

BUTTLE, Frank Taylor [Constable/ 1st class/ No.105] = He was transferred from Geraldton in October 1894 and then transferred to North Fremantle in February 1896.²⁰ Another source states that he was the first Officer in Charge and suggests that he moved from Cue to open the new station in November 1894,²¹ where he stayed until he was transferred away in about March 1896.²²

CAMPBELL, Edward [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.188] = He was transferred from Perth in January 1902 and then transferred to Mount Magnet in November 1902.²³

CUSACK, Charles Bernard [Constable/ over 10 years/ No.493] = He was transferred from Cue in August 1914 then transferred to Wagin in February 1917.²⁴

DALLY, Frederick [Constable/ 10 years/ No.577and 915] = He was transferred from Perth in January 1919 and then transferred to Cue in August 1919.²⁵

DALTON, James Henry [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.529] = He was transferred from Perth in March 1902 and then transferred to Perth in August 1902.²⁶

EAST, Frederick William [Probationary Constable/ No.764] = He was transferred from Perth in October 1902 and then transferred to West Perth in January 1907.²⁷

FOGARTY, Joseph A [Probationary Constable/ No.618] = He was transferred from Perth in August 1902 and dismissed in September 1902.²⁸

JOHNSTON, George [Constable/ 1st class/ No.234] = He was transferred from West Perth in August 1902 and then transferred to Perth in July 1905.²⁹

LASLETT, Herbert Arthur [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.182] = He was transferred from Jarrahdale in June 1901. He resigned in July 1905.³⁰

MARTIN, Alfred James [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.848] = He was transferred from Perth in June 1906 and then transferred back to Perth in May 1909.³¹

MITCHELL, William [Probationary Constable/ No.480] = He was transferred from Perth in June 1899 and then transferred to Nannine in September 1899.³²

NEAGLE, William [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.340] = He was transferred from Nannine in April 1898 and then transferred to Wiluna in January 1899.³³

PILKINGTON, George [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.35] = He was transferred from North Fremantle in February 1896³⁴ and arrived in March to be the Officer in Charge.³⁵ He transferred to Mount Magnet in September 1898.³⁶

POLLARD, James Baughan [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.858] = He was transferred from Perth in October 1905 and removed? in March 1907.³⁷

PITMAN, Alexander Henry [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.425] = He was transferred from Sir Samuel in November 1901 and then transferred to Cue in March 1902.³⁸

REYNOLDS, Peter [Probationary Constable/ No.72] = He was transferred from Perth in January 1900 and then transferred to Sir Samuel in December 1901.³⁹

THOMAS, John Alexander [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.869] = He was transferred from Perth in March 1906 and then transferred to Cue in June 1909.⁴⁰

TROTMAN, Albert Howard [Constable/ No.723] = He was transferred from Gullewa in May 1907 and then transferred to Dwellingup in May 1916.⁴¹

WALKER, William [Constable/ 1st class/ No.197] = He was transferred from Cue in September 1898 and then transferred to Perth in July 1899.⁴²

WARNECKE, Albert [Constable/ 1st class/ No.116] = He was transferred from Perth in June 1899 and then transferred to Nannine in January 1900.⁴³

WILLIAMS, Thomas [Constable/ over 10 years/ No.483] = He was transferred from Perth in December 1917 and then transferred back to Perth in April 1919.⁴⁴

WOLFE, Michael James [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.124] = He was transferred from Geraldton in January 1897 and then transferred to Perth in January 1898.⁴⁵

HEALTH

DOCTORS

OLLIVEY, William James = He is listed as a surgeon in the 1895⁴⁶ through to the 1897 directories.⁴⁷

WILSON, Thomas = He is listed as a surgeon in the 1898 postal directory.⁴⁸

MINING REGISTRAR

KIELY, Charles J = He is listed as the Mining Registrar in the 1898 postal directory.⁴⁹

EDUCATION = William CARLSON was listed as running a private school in the 1895 Postal Directory,⁵⁰ which is still listed in the 1897 directory.⁵¹

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The town was connected by rail.

STATION MASTERS

McGLEW, S. = He is listed as the station master in the 1910 postal directory.⁵²

OXLEY, Thomas = He is listed as the station master in the 1898 postal directory.⁵³

POSTAL SERVICES = The post office was opened in 1894.⁵⁴ It was gutted by fire on the night of the 17th of October 1898. By April 21st 1900 a new wood and iron building was nearing completion.⁵⁵

POSTMASTERS

HORRIGAN, J. = He is listed as the post master in the 1910 postal directory.⁵⁶

VINCENT, David = He is listed as the post master in the 1898 postal directory.⁵⁷

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION

BARRIER HOTEL = W. H. GOLLOP is listed in Wisers 1895 postal directory,⁵⁸ but by the 1897 directory he has either changed the name of the Barrier Hotel to the Golconda Hotel or has moved to a hotel of that name.⁵⁹

COMET? HOTEL = Phillip NERI senior is listed as being there in the 1910 postal directory.⁶⁰

COMMERCIAL HOTEL = Police records suggest that James WATSON was the licensee in November 1895,⁶¹ but C. T. S. MARSH is listed in Wisers 1895 postal directory.⁶² Charles C. WRIGHT is listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁶³

COSMOPOLITAN HOTEL = J. GRIBBLE is listed as being there in the 1910 postal directory.⁶⁴

DAY DAWN HOTEL = Mrs WATKINS was the proprietor in November 1894⁶⁵ although James WATKINS is listed in Wisers 1895 postal directory,⁶⁶ and is still listed in the 1897 directory.⁶⁷ William BLACKWELL is listed as being there in the 1898 postal directory.⁶⁸ T. Harry MARSHALL is listed as being there in the 1910 postal directory.⁶⁹

GOLCONDA HOTEL = William H. GALLOP of the Barrier Hotel has either changed hotels or hotel names by 1897 and is now listed in the postal directory at the Golconda.⁷⁰ This continues as the listing for 1898.⁷¹ The 1910 postal directory lists Miss A REIDY.⁷²

GRAND HOTEL = P. J. FITZPATRICK is listed in Wisers 1895 postal directory,⁷³ and by the 1897 directory, appears to have been joined by Charles HILLYARD.⁷⁴ Harold F. SMITH is listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁷⁵ George LEWIS is listed as being there in the 1910 postal directory.⁷⁶

GREAT FINGAL HOTEL = The 1910 postal directory lists J. LAWSON.⁷⁷

BOARDING HOUSE 1 = Samuel GAMBLES boarding house is listed in Wisers 1895 postal directory,⁷⁸ and is still listed in the 1897 directory.⁷⁹

DEW DROP INN = It is not known what sort of business this was, but the 1910 postal directory lists H. F. GIBSON as being there.⁸⁰

OTHER BUSINESSES

? = A G NEWELL is listed as the Manager for Crooks & Brooker in the 1898 postal directory.⁸¹

ACCOUNTANT 1 = William CARLSON is listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁸²

ACCOUNTANT 2 = William JACOBSON is listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁸³

ACCOUNTANT 3 = P. R. STEENBERG is listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁸⁴

ASSAYER = Herbert E. EIMES is listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁸⁵

AUCTIONEERS etc = Goodfellow & Moloney, also of Cue are listed in the 1898 postal directory.⁸⁶

BAKER 1 = H. W. EDWARDS is listed as a baker in the 1895⁸⁷ through to the 1897 postal directories.⁸⁸

BAKER 2 = Peter NELSON is listed as a baker in the 1895⁸⁹ through to the 1897 postal directories.⁹⁰

BAKER 3 = William LOCKWOOD is listed as a baker in the 1898 postal directory.⁹¹

BAKER 4 = Henry SEFTEL is listed as a baker in the 1898 postal directory.⁹²

BAKER 5 = E. BASTIAN and Henry BASTIAN of Bastian Bros are listed in the 1910 postal directory as storekeepers as well as bakers.⁹³

BAKER 6 = Fred MUHLEISON is listed as a baker in the 1910 postal directory.⁹⁴

BANK - UNION BANK OF AUSTRALIA LTD = The 1897 postal directory lists an agency for the bank,⁹⁵ but by 1910 it may have become a branch.⁹⁶

MANAGER

STUDD, S. = S. SUDD is listed as the Bank Manager in the 1910 postal directory.⁹⁷

BANK - WESTERN AUSTRALIA BANK = The 1897 postal directory lists the bank.⁹⁸ By 1910 it is a sub-branch of the Cue office.⁹⁹

MANAGERS

BROAD, J. H. = He is listed as the Bank Manager in the 1910 postal directory.¹⁰⁰

GUNNING, A. S. McD = He is listed as the Bank Manager in the 1898 postal directory.¹⁰¹

BLACKSMITH 1 = McInerney Bros are listed as blacksmiths in the 1895,¹⁰² through to the 1897 postal directories.¹⁰³

BLACKSMITH 2 = Peter COX is listed as a blacksmith in the 1898 postal directory.¹⁰⁴

BLACKSMITH [2] 3 & LIVERY STABLE = The 1910 postal directory lists C. CAMPBELL of Campbell & Co.¹⁰⁵

BLACKSMITH [3] 4 = The 1910 postal directory lists T. THOMPSON.¹⁰⁶

BLACKSMITH [4] 5 = The 1910 postal directory lists Thomas TRELOAR.¹⁰⁷

BICYCLE AGENT = The 1910 postal directory lists B. BECKETT.¹⁰⁸

BOOT MAKER 1 = The 1895 postal directory lists C. MEFFERT,¹⁰⁹ and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹¹⁰

BOOT MAKER 2 = The 1895 postal directory lists F. WEBSTER.¹¹¹

BOOT MAKER 3 = The 1910 postal directory lists C. MATTHEWS.¹¹²

BUILDER = The 1910 postal directory lists Jones & Gould.¹¹³

BUTCHER 1 = Tulloch & Co opened their new stone building in November 1895.¹¹⁴ Tulloch, Kerr & Willis are listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹¹⁵ By April 1901 James Bett [Jim] WILLIS, John TULLOCH and Bill KERR were also operating a butchery in Cue, with both trading as Tulloch & Co.¹¹⁶

BUTCHER 2 = Isaac HUNTER of the Ham & Beef Shop is listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹¹⁷

BUTCHER 2 = Samuel SILBERMAN of the Ham & Beef Shop is listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹¹⁸

BUTCHER [2] 4 = The 1910 postal directory lists Edward C. CLARK of Clark Bros & Co.¹¹⁹

BUTCHER [3] 5 = The 1910 postal directory lists E. and S. CLARKSON of Clarkson Bros as butchers and cafe operators.¹²⁰

CAFE 1 = The 1910 postal directory lists E. and S. CLARKSON of Clarkson Bros as butchers and cafe operators.¹²¹

CAFE 2 = The 1910 postal directory lists Mrs E. FORBES.¹²²

CAFE 3 = The 1910 postal directory lists Mrs J MALONEY's Refreshment Rooms, which may have been related to the railway station.¹²³

CARPENTER = Edward E. EDGE is listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹²⁴

CARTER 1 = William BOURKE is listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹²⁵

CARTER 2 = John MALONEY is listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹²⁶

CHEMIST 1 = The 1895 postal directory lists A. D. HARROP,¹²⁷ and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹²⁸

CHEMIST 2 = John J. McCARTHEY is listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹²⁹

COMMISSION AGENT = The 1895 postal directory lists James R. TAIT,¹³⁰ and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹³¹

CORN MERCHANT = The 1895 postal directory lists W. R. JACKSON,¹³² and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹³³

DRAPER 1 = The 1895 postal directory lists Mrs MAYNARD,¹³⁴ and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹³⁵

DRAPER 2 = The 1895 postal directory lists Meffert & Evors,¹³⁶ and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹³⁷

DRAPER 3 = D. and W. PATRICK of Patrick Bros are listed in the 1898 postal directory.¹³⁸

FRUITERER 1 = The 1910 postal directory lists Kailis Bros.¹⁴²

FRUITERER 3 = The 1910 postal directory lists H. SILBERMAN.¹⁴⁴

FRUITERER 4 = The 1910 postal directory lists S. S. SMITH.¹⁴⁵

ICE WORKS = The 1910 postal directory lists George L. POOLE as the manager of the Western Fresh Food & Ice Co, Ltd.¹⁵⁴

IRONMONGER = The 1895 postal directory lists R. P. YOUNG,¹⁵⁵ and the entry appears in the directories until 1897.¹⁵⁶

DEAD FINISH - Earlier name for - CUDDINGWARRA.

DEAD FINISH

LOCATION = Near O'Grady Creek on the north side of the Ashburton River. Roughly thirty two kilometres east south east of the Mount Mortimer diggings.²¹²

INDUSTRY = Gold mining. On the Ashburton gold field.

OTHER BUSINESSES

STOREKEEPER = There was a store there in about 1890.²¹³

DEEP WELL - This was an earlier name for either - NANNOWTHARRA - or - THE BROTHERS.

DELAMBRE ISLAND

LOCATION = Latitude 20° 26' south by Longitude 117° 5' east.

INDUSTRY = Turtle shell. Slave trade

HISTORY = There are descriptions of a turtle shell industry conducted on Barrow and Delambre islands in 1871/72.²¹⁴ This business appears to have been operated in conjunction with the pearling industry. In the early 1870's Captain CADELL established a slave market for both male and female Aboriginal people on Barrow, Delambre and Enderby Islands.²¹⁵

DELANEY'S REEF - Original name for - CARLAMINDA.

DELLERTON RAILWAY SIDING

LOCATION = Latitude 33° 53.5' south by Longitude 115° 41.5' east at the 173 mile 11 chain mark of the Government railway line between Wonnerup and Nannup.²¹⁶

HISTORY = This was a private siding for the Sussex Timber Company mill opened in June 1924 and named after D. Ellerton BROWN, a director of Millars Timber & Trading Company. The lease of the siding was cancelled in October 1944 and the points and additional rails were removed in January 1945.²¹⁷

DESDAMONIA - A spelling version of - DESDEMONA.

DESDEMONA

LOCATION = Between the present towns of Menzies and Leonora.²¹⁸

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION

DESDEMONA HOTEL = Joseph CADDY is listed there in the 1910 postal directory.²¹⁹

BOARDING HOUSE 1 = Agnes E. KELLIHER is listed there in the 1910 postal directory.²²⁰

BOARDING HOUSE 2 = Jeremiah MORAN is listed there in the 1910 postal directory.²²¹

OTHER BUSINESSES

BAKER = The 1910 postal directory lists John LEYDEN.²²²

BUTCHER & GREENGROCER = The 1910 postal directory lists Thomas J. HERON.²²³

CYANIDERS = The 1910 postal directory lists David MURIE and George MASON of Murie & Mason.²²⁴

HAIRDRESSER = The 1910 postal directory lists Albert WESTPHAL.²²⁵

ORE BATTERY = The 1910 postal directory lists Fred A. YOUNG as the battery manager. Probably indicating a public battery.²²⁶ The Desdamona State Battery was located at Latitude 29° 05.8' south by Longitude 121° 22.3' east.²²⁷

STOREKEEPER 1 = The 1910 postal directory lists of Arthur M. WEBSTER and Ernest R. RICHARDSON of Webster & Richardson.²²⁸

DESMOND

LOCATION = In the Ravensthorpe area. Latitude 33° 37.5 south by Longitude 120° 08.7' east.²²⁹

EDUCATION = Children were taught in a private three bedroom house in about 1907 in what may have been a private arrangement.

Unfortunately there is some confusion over the dates involved with the Government school. Although start up dates from different sources supply the years of 1907, 1908 and 1909 the only final year of operations recorded appears to be 1915. The schools name is also recorded as either the Desmond School or the Elverdton School. The name of the mine was and is the Elverdton Copper Mine, but the surveyed town site is Desmond and the school was on the town site.²³⁰

SCHOOL TEACHERS.

HATFIELD, Len or Lou = This nineteen year old was the first government school teacher.

SPEARS, [Mr] = He was appointed in about September 1910.²³¹

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The railway siding on the Hopetoun to Ravensthorpe rail line was opened in 1909.²³²

OTHER BUSINESSES

BLACKSMITH = T. S. NICHOLAS is listed in the 1920 postal directory.²³³

STOREKEEPER = Francis J. DAW is listed in the 1920 postal directory.²³⁴

DIORITE KING - An early name for - KURRAJONG.

DONNELLY RIVER TIMBER MILL - YORNUP AREA

LOCATION = Latitude 34° 6.1' south by Longitude 115° 58.6' east.²³⁵

INDUSTRY = Timber.

HISTORY = Bunnings began construction of this mill and also presumably the nineteen kilometres of company railway line back to Yornup in April 1948. Going into production in January 1949. Logs were originally railed in from lines east of the mill, but this changed to road transport in the early 1950's. The rail line to Yornup remained in use until the last steam locomotive was retired in March 1970. The mill itself closed in 1978 and found use as a holiday camp.²³⁶

DORE ISLAND

LOCATION =

HEALTH = There was a Hospital there by about 1909.²³⁷

DOYLES WELL - Originally called - CUTMORE'S WELL.²³⁸

LOCATION = Between Leonora and Agnew at the confluence of the Turkey and Wilson Creeks.²³⁹

INDUSTRY = Wayside in and coaching stop.

TRANSPORT SERVICES = In 1903 it was a stop on the coach service that ran from Leonora to Lawlers three days a week.

²⁴⁰ There were stockmen working for the stagecoach lines stationed there until at least about 1912.²⁴¹

HISTORY = The well was dug as a water supply for William CUTMORE, Jack DOYLE and John LEYLAND who found gold early in 1894 at what became known as Diorite. Water was scarce there so a well was sunk some distance to the north at what was known at times as Cutmore's and Doyle's Well. By 1895 the name Doyles well seems to have won out and in December 1896 the 5,000 acre reserve 3741 for travellers and stock was created around the well to serve the traffic to the gold fields to the north.²⁴²

In December 1912 Jack DOYLE perished from thirst within thirteen kilometres of Doyles Well.²⁴³

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION = A place for rest and recreation was set up, but the date of establishment is not certain. Certainly in July 1896 Richard LEVINGE applied for a Wayside Inn license, but this may not have been granted. The earliest known successful licence was for 1898 in the name of John HOLEHAN trading as the Doyles Well hotel.²⁴⁴ The 1920 postal directory lists Fred STAUNTON there.²⁴⁵

The business continued trading under several managers until about 1944/45 when the licence was suspended. The license was re-issued in 1947 and the business continued to trade until it was surrendered in 1950. At one time DOYLES WELL was apparently the source of supply for several illicit inns in the settlements to its north. The configuration of the original buildings is not certain, but by about the early 1900's there was thought to have been a bar, six bedrooms, a sitting room, a dining room and a kitchen.²⁴⁶ The building was in a parlous state by about 1937 and the manager Angelo POLETTI had it pulled it down and erected a mud brick structure with a bar, four bedrooms a dining room, plus the managers rooms. Under his stewardship which lasted until about 1943 there was a swimming pool, electric lighting plant, skating rink, four tennis courts, a bowling alley and a large bough shed added. There was also a big sports oval alongside and two large windmills for the water supply.²⁴⁷

DUKETON

LOCATION = North of the present town of Laverton.

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION

GOLDEN SPINIFEX HOTEL = The 1905 postal directory lists Alfred J. TAYLOR there.²⁴⁸

OTHER BUSINESSES

BAKER = William HORSBACH is listed in the 1905 postal directory.²⁴⁹

BANK - BANK OF AUSTRALASIA = George C. R. FARQUHARSON is listed as the manager of the Bank in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵⁰

BANK - WESTERN AUSTRALIA BANK = Walter M. HEARN is listed as the manager of the Bank in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵¹

BUTCHER = Cox & Co are listed in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵²

NEWS & COMMISSION AGENT = John J. GALLAGHER is listed in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵³

ORE BATTERY = By 1905 the postal directory is listing a Government battery.²⁵⁴

RESTAURANT 1 = Miss Matilda ESCREET is listed as operating a restaurant at the Mulga Queen in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵⁵

RESTAURANT 2 = Robert GOLDEN is listed as operating what is presumably a second restaurant in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵⁶

STOREKEEPER 1 = The 1905 postal directory lists Walter RITCHIE as a storekeeper.²⁵⁷

STOREKEEPER 2 = John FOX of Fox & Field is listed with the store actually being managed by James CUNNINGHAM in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵⁸

DUNCAN'S TIMBER MILL - DWELLINGUP AREA

LOCATION = About twenty kilometres east north east of Dwellingup on one of the many company railway lines which formerly ran out from the Holyoake Timber Mill.²⁵⁹

DUNDAS

LOCATION = In the Dundas Shire about twenty one kilometres south of the present town of Norseman. Latitude 32° 23' south by Longitude 121° 46' east.

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HISTORY = In September 1892 gold was discovered in the Dundas hills and reported to the police at Esperance, leading to the Dundas Goldfield being declared in August 1893.²⁶⁰ The town was gazetted in 1895, and derives its name from its situation at the southern end of the Dundas Hills named by Surveyor General John Septimus ROE in 1848 after Captain DUNDAS of the Royal Navy ship H.M.S. Tagus.

UTILITIES = A number of Government water condensers managed by George SLANE, STEWART, BALLOCH, McINTYRE and HORESMAN are listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁶¹ Only one entry for KESSELL managing a Government condenser is listed in the 1898 directory.²⁶²

CONDENSORS [PRIVATE]

CONDENSER 1 = Thomas and JOHN EATT of Eatt Bros are listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁶³

CONDENSER 2 = W. FLEMING and Patrick MURPHY of Fleming & Murphy are listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁶⁴

CONDENSER 3 = Henry GLASSFORD and Peter RAFFERTY of Glassford & Rafferty are listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁶⁵ P RAFFERTY is also mentioned in the 1898 directory.²⁶⁶

CONDENSER 4 = Thomas WHITEHEAD is listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁶⁷

POLICE & COURTS = The Police Station was opened in January 1895.²⁶⁸ A tender for the police quarters and stables was advertised in 1896.²⁶⁹ The station closed in February 1898.²⁷⁰

POLICE OFFICERS

COMRIE, John Holthouse [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.196] = From Esperance in April 1897 to the to Kalgoorlie in February 1898²⁷¹ when the station closed.²⁷²

LAPPIN, William [Corporal/ No.39] = From Albany²⁷³ to take over as Officer in Charge in September 1895.²⁷⁴ Transferred to Norseman in July 1896.²⁷⁵

MURPHY, Patrick [Constable/ 3rd class/ Pre-numbered] = Although he is recorded as transferring from Albany in November 1894²⁷⁶ he doesn't seem to have taken up duties as the original Officer in Charge until January 1895.²⁷⁷ He resigned in November 1895,²⁷⁸ but this may have been as a result of an inquiry in September.²⁷⁹

O'HALLORAN, Patrick [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.98] = From Albany in November 1894 then to Niagara in April 1899.²⁸⁰ This would appear to be well after the Dundas station closed.

TEAHAN, John Patrick [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.113] = From Albany in December 1895 then to Norseman in July 1897.²⁸¹

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The 1897²⁸² and 1898 postal directories list a coach service from Coolgardie.²⁸³

POSTAL & COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

POSTMASTER

GILCHRIST, N. A. = He is listed in the 1898 postal directory.²⁸⁴

TELEGRAPHIST

FAHEY, E. A. = He is listed in the 1898 postal directory.²⁸⁵

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION

DUNDAS HOTEL = C SIMMS is listed there in the 1897 postal directory.²⁸⁶ SCOTT is listed at an un-named hotel in the 1898 postal directory.²⁸⁷ The 1905 postal directory lists George C. ROSS as being there.²⁸⁸

BOARDING HOUSE 1 = Miss HIGGINS is listed there in the 1898 postal directory.²⁸⁹

OTHER BUSINESSES - By 1905 there are no shops listed in the postal directory.²⁹⁰

ACCOUNTANT = D. M. CAMPBELL is listed in the 1898 postal directory.²⁹¹

BLACKSMITH 1 = William G. CLARKE is listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁹²

BLACKSMITH 2 = P. S. HARRIS is listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁹³

BLACKSMITH 3 = Thomas SMALES is listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁹⁴

BLACKSMITH 4 = J. STRONGMAN is listed in the 1897²⁹⁵ and the 1898 postal directory.²⁹⁶

CARPENTER 1 = George BRAND is listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁹⁷

CARPENTER 1 = Sydney WOODS is listed in the 1897 postal directory.²⁹⁸

ORE BATTERY = H. TUNNINGTON managing what is assumed to be a public battery is listed in the 1898 postal directory.²⁹⁹

STOREKEEPER 1 = John Robert DUNN, James DUNN and Henry GRIFFITHS of Dunn Bros & Griffiths are listed in the 1897 postal directory.³⁰⁰

STOREKEEPER 2 = Alf DUNSTONE is listed in the 1897 postal directory.³⁰¹

STOREKEEPER 3 = W. S. MATTINSON is listed in the 1897 postal directory.³⁰²

STOREKEEPER 4 - Luigi and V. GATTI and G. ZACALI of Gatti & Co are listed in the 1898 postal directory.³⁰³

STOREKEEPER 4 - Thomas HIBBET is listed in the 1898 postal directory.³⁰⁴

STOREKEEPER 5 - Thomas WHITEHEAD is listed in the 1898 postal directory.³⁰⁵

LOCATION = On a branch of the Ord River in the east Kimberleys.³¹⁰

INDUSTRY = Police.

HISTORY = There was a police camp there in the first half of the 1890's.³¹¹

DUNNSVILLE

LOCATION = Latitude 30° 38' south by Longitude 120° 52' east.

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HISTORY = The town was named after John DUNNE, a prospector who discovered gold in this vicinity in August 1894.

DUNNE's lease later became the *Wealth of Nations* Mine.

The site was declared a townsite in 1897.

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The 1898 postal directory lists a coach from Coolgardie.³¹²

HOTEL & ACCOMMODATION

DUNNSVILLE HOTEL = William A. SAYER is listed there in the 1898 postal directory.³¹³

OTHER BUSINESSES

BUTCHER 1 = Edward and George BURNELL of Burnell Bros are listed in the 1898 postal directory.³¹⁴

STOREKEEPER 1 = Albert R. WILSON and William B. ARCHBOLD of Wilson & Archbold are listed in the 1898 postal directory.³¹⁵

DYKES TIMBER MILL - This timber mill appears to have been in the close vicinity of Gidgegannup and is assumed to have been within the boundaries of the existing township.
